## User Interface (UI) Basics

- Two main organizing concepts:
  - Sites - three types ('MyWorkspace', 'Class' and 'Project' site types)
  - Tools - within each site, grouping of related functionality
- Navigation
  - Tabs - switch between sites
  - Left Navigation Bar - switch between tools



## UI is Portal-based

A portal is an application that provides single sign-on, personalization, and content aggregation

- Single sign-on - allows users to get to all their site in one place
- Personalization - logging in provides user access to his/her sites & customization or presentation
- Content aggregation - allows users to see content across sites (e.g. MyWorkspace) or tools (e.g. Home)



## Tools Overview

- Home - aggregated 'view' of announcements, discussion and chat
- Announcements - site-wide message posting
- Assignments - file-based assessment tool with letter grades
- Chat - simultaneous online discussion
- Discussion - asynchronous communication organized by categories



## Tools Overview

- Email Archive - record of email sent to site's email distribution list
- Gradebook - class grade manager, links to Tests & Quizzes
- Resources - upload and organize files, link and documents
  - Drop Box - student-labeled Resources folder for quick document submission
- Schedule - event announcement and management



## Tools Overview

- Syllabus - structured course outline
- Tests & Quizzes - assessment authoring, delivery and evaluation environment
- Site Info - admin tool for site maintain-ers
- Web-Content - promote outside web material to 'tool' level



## Instructor

- Access/functionality controlled by system 'role' ('maintain' in default configuration)
- Has author/admin privileges for any site with s/he has 'maintain' role
- Can be automatically designated the 'maintain' role if the person is the 'instructor of record' in the campus SIS



## Student

- Generally has 'access' role in any class site, can submit material but not admin site
- Can be given a higher privilege role, e.g. if a teaching assistant
- Can create collaborative 'project sites'



## Administration/Support

- These users have 'admin' role and can access/edit any site or tool within the system
- Have a special 'Administrator Site' with admin-only tools for system configuration and site maintenance



## Sakai in different contexts

- Presentation or 'skin' can be customized at institution or site level
  - Sub-institution schools or departments can have unique skins
- Sakai - as a platform - can deliver other tools
  - OSPI's ePortfolio



## Create Course Content

(instructor)

- Upload content into Resources and organize
- Include outside content as a 'tool'
- Create an assessment (test)



## Use Course Content

(student)

- Check schedule
- Take Assessment
- Upload Final Paper to Drop Box
- Pick-up papers with WebDAV (instructor)
